DISCUSS & ENGAGE THE SCRIPTURES

- 1. Read Matthew 26:13. What Jesus sets in motion stays in motion. What would your life be like if you lived as if it all mattered?
 - This is a great question to connect the dots of us living as creators. What would it look like if we declared identity over our families every day? What if we did the most mundane task as if unto the Lord with joy in our hearts? As a leader, how can you help people catch a vision for living a bigger life in the midst of what we might see as small?
- 2. Read Romans 12:4-5 and Proverbs 15:22. Who is allowed to speak into your life, and how's it going? Who do you need to tell about how good Jesus has been to you? In your attendance, add notes on this question. **"**This is a topic that can be challenging, so we want to equip you with more language around the difference between those who speak into our life and those we do life with because they may not be the same. Both play vital roles in our lives as disciples of Jesus! Godly relationships are intentional relationships where we talk about, learn about, and become like Jesus together. A <u>Circle</u> is three or more people who meet to discuss the weekend message, engage Scripture, and pray together. Circles and godly relationships differ in the following ways:

- 3. Read <u>1 Corinthians 10:31</u> and <u>Zechariah 4:10</u>. In the kingdom, there are no small things. Where are you despising the small things, and how is it impacting others in your life?

 Another way to help us see the ripple effect of our own life is to reflect on those who have had an impact on us. If you get stuck, that may be a great way to unlock the conversation.
- 4. Read <u>Mark 11:23</u>. What is the mountain you need to release to receive the ripple of the life of Jesus?
 - As these are shared, a great response could be "in Jesus' name, may it be so!"

PRAY

Jesus, may we be aware of the ripple effect we have as Your disciples.
